Born in Ukraine in the city of Kvjv, Inna is a strong and resilient girl who loved going to school. Her dreams were big and wide, and she was working hard to achieve them. However, few months ago, a war broke out between Russia and Ukraine and for Inna everything changed. The war was affecting humanity, education, and so much more. After a bomb was dropped in her city, Inna's family had to leave to escape danger. She is now currently in England, staying with her cousins.
